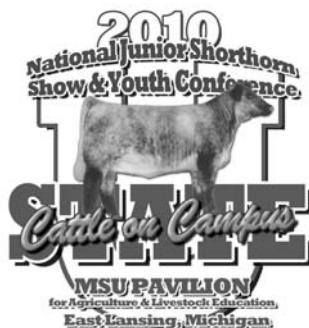

## **JUNIOR EXHIBITORS SHOW NATIONAL CHAMPION SHORTHORNS**

2010 National Junior Shorthorn Show & Conference – East Lansing, Mich.



East Lansing, Mich., (July 7, 2010) – Junior Shorthorn exhibitors from 24 states, arrived in East Lansing, Mich., over the week of June 21- 26 to enter the “Cattle on Campus” themed 2010 National Junior Shorthorn Show & Conference. A total of 428 head of cattle, were exhibited at the Michigan State University (MSU) grounds competing in eight different shows: Owned Purebred Females, Bred & Owned Females, Bred & Owned Bulls, Purebred Cow/Calf Pairs, ShorthornPlus Cow/Calf Pairs, Purebred Steers, ShorthornPlus Steers, and ShorthornPlus Females. Evaluating the owned shows was father son team, Jeff and Jared Bedwell of Okla., and assessing the bred and owned shows was Blake Bloomberg of Okla.

Bringing home Junior National Champion Shorthorn Female honors amidst 236 other purebred Shorthorn females was CYT MAX ROSA 9111 ET, owned by Jordan Crall, Albia, Iowa. This Division V winner, born March 2009, is a daughter of CF SOLUTION X ET and MINDEMANN MAX ROSA 310 ET. Kane Aegerter of Seward, Neb., showed the Reserve National Champion Shorthorn Female, SULL SALUTE DESTINY 9001, a May 2009 daughter of SULL GNCC SALUTE 532R ET and WHR V8 DESTINY CHOICE3948. Aegerter’s female was also the Champion Division III Female.

Kane Aegerter , Seward, Neb., lead his two females, Reserve National Champion SULL SALUTE DESTINY 9001 and Division VI Champion CYT JUNE FLOWER 9107 ET, to the Champion Pair of Purebred Females. The state of Indiana claimed the Best State Group of 4 Purebred Females.

Fifty-three females were shown in the Bred & Owned Female Show, in which John Reasor, Wildwood, Ga., took home Grand Champion Female honors with R/F Miss Sweet Caroline ET. This November 2008 heifer sired by HD Big and Rich 204 ET and dam HD Platimun's Sweet 16 was also the Senior Female Division Champion. Paris Augusta 921 captured Reserve Champion honors. The April 2009 heifer was shown by Chelsea Spencer, Chickasha, Okla. Paris Augusta 921 was sired by MAV Freebird 522R with dam SULL Secret Cherry ET and was also the Junior Female Division Champion. Shelby Pick, Redmond, Ore. captured the Champion Pair of Bred & Owned Females with her Senior Calf Division winner LLS Sexy Lexy and class winner LLS Reba's Dee-Lite.

On Friday afternoon, 57 ShorthornPlus Females, 9 of which were also bred and owned by the exhibitor walked the ring. SULL Hot Tamale 9036 was selected as the Grand Champion ShorthornPlus Female as well as being the Grand Champion Bred & Owned ShorthornPlus Female, owned by Nick Sullivan, Dunlap, Iowa. This Division III winner is sired by SULL Right Direction ET with dam SULL Tamale, born March 2009. Reserve Champion honors as well as Reserve Bred & Owned and also out of Division III, was again Nick Sullivan with his April 2009 heifer. SULL Breathless Solution ET, a CF Solution X ET daughter with dam SULL Breathless P898.

Outstanding numbers in the Cow/Calf shows this year with Grand Champion Purebred Cow/Calf honors going to SULL Seductive Rose 645 ET, and her calf SH Sinful Rose 0215. The 2006-born cow is the offspring of CF Solution X ET and her April 2010 heifer calf is sired by AF SL Sin City ET. This pair is owned by Sterling Reichenbach, of Bath, Mich. In the reserve slot was SULL Myrtle Bo Babe 8118 ET and her calf CVF JB 221X. This 2008-born cow is the offspring of WHR Sonny 8114 ET and her Feb. 2010 calf is out of Jake's Proud Jazz 266L. Autumn Robison of Markle, Ind., exhibited this duo.

Grand Champion ShorthornPlus Cow/Calf was exhibited by Ashley Vogel, Hartley, Iowa. MAV Minnie 890Ua 2008 cow out of HI View's Ace of Diamonds, and her calf MAV Stacie 026X was born April 2010 and sired by GFS Creole 9590 ET. Reserve ShorthornPlus pair was GF Annie Oakley TP 801, a 2008-born cow sired by CF Trump X and her calf Patton FG Annie Oakley012 born Feb. 2010 sired by Lagrand Easy Upgrade 4223, shown by Kade Patton, Frankfort, Ind.

In the Purebred Bred and Owned Bull Show SCC Blood Brother 8945 stole the show by taking home Grand Champion Bull. He was exhibited by Ry Stover, Binger, Okla. This Sept. 2008, bull is sired by HD Bloodstone 603 ET. WF White Gold took Reserve Champion honors. This May 2009 bull is sired by JA Canadian Gold 26T and owned by J C Walker, Mt Zion, Ill.

The Grand Champion Prospect Steer honor as well as Reserve Overall Purebred Steer was awarded to GORS Lucky, an 858-pound prospect by Jake's Proud Jazz 266L, shown by Harley Sargent, Denison, Texas. The Reserve Grand Champion Prospect Steer was BSC Luke, a 562-pound son of J Art Lights Out 328. This calf is owned by Jacob West, Fayette, Ohio.

Kate Geiman, Carlton, Mich., took Grand Champion Shorthorn Market Steer and Overall Grand Purebred Steer honors with her steer IA Mighty Whitey 934, a 1345-pound son of Rumor Has It 2S. The Reserve Champion went CF BSG Elmo 956 X shown by Dakota Vonderhaar, Eaton, Ohio., a son of SULL GNCC Eldorado ET weighing in at 1235.

NPS One In a Million, shown by Lane Steinke, Rensselaer, Ind., was named the Grand Champion Bred and Owned Steer. Steer weighed 1260 and a son of Jake's Proud Jazz 266L. The Reserve Grand Champion Bred and Owned Steer honors went to Cody Korthaus, Moulton, Iowa., with his steer Circle K Joe K69. This steer was sired by Oakview Trump Card and weighed in at 1300.

The Grand Champion ShorthornPlus Steer went to KL Maverick exhibited by Blake McOllough, Clarion, Iowa. McOllough's steer was sired by Vanilla Ice and weighed in at 1200. Atlanta Maronde, York, Neb., took home Reserve Champion honors with her steer Rhino. Weighing in at 1220, Rhino is a son of DJS New Horizon 201.
